Student accommodation in Denmark

- Like most educational institutions in Denmark: Zealand has no accommodation facilities
 - You have to find a place to live by yourself but Zealand staff can offer guidance and support!
- Most students either:
 - Rent a student hall of residence (kollegium) a single room with small toilet and bath
 - Rent a room in a shared apartment
- It can be hard to find especially close to Campus and in the city center of Copenhagen
 - We suggest that you start applying for accommodation now
 - **TIP:** Broaden your search for accommodation to cities in the neighborhood or cities with great connections to either Roskilde, Køge or Næstved. You can use a journey planner (last slide) to investigate the travelling time
- Hostels/hotels/Airbnb might also be an option to begin with
 - Student Hotels: Due to COVID-19 some hotels offer rent on monthly basis with student discount (see last slide)
- It is usually easier to find something when you are settled in Denmark!

Some basics about (student) accommodation in Denmark

What should you be aware of?

- You normally need to pay the first months rent + a deposit of three months rent as an initial payment
- The initial payment will be returned to you when you move out (with deduction for maintenance costs)
- · Costs for electricity, heath etc. might not be included in the rent
- You need to give three months notice prior to moving out to the landlord (you can not move out from one day to the next)
- It can be expensive to get settled in Denmark
 - Our advice: Save up money for the first 6 months before arriving to Denmark

Some basics about (student) accommodation in Denmark

What about the price?

- In general, accommodation in Denmark is expensive
- The rent usually range from EUR 280 to EUR 600 per person depending on location and standard
- Accommodation in the Copenhagen area is usually more expensive
- Tip: You might be entitled to housing benefits (boligstøtte) financial support from the state authorities (ONLY FOR EU CITIZENS!!)

How to find accommodation?

- You can sign up for waiting lists to accommodation already now!
- Students need to show a final admission letter in order to fulfill the requirements for student residence (kollegium)
