# What is a CPR number and why do you need it?

## **What is a CPR number?**

- A CPR number is a personal identification. The CPR number consists of ten digits – the first six digits are your date of birth and the last four are your unique identification number.

## **Why do you need a CPR number?**

- You are legally required to have a CPR number when you are residing in Denmark (for more than 3 months).
- Almost all public authorities in Denmark use the CPR registry system to avoid duplicate registration and to secure a person's identity.
- You can use your CPR number in many situations:
  - To open a Danish bank account
  - When you are at the doctor (the yellow health insurance card)
  - Danish phone number
  - Travel card (rejsekort)

**NB! You shouldn't hand out your CPR number to everyone.**

# How to get the CPR number

- You must have a Residence Permit (Non EU students) or an EU Residence Document (EU students) in order to receive the Danish CPR number
- EU students have to book an appointment with the Danish Agency for International Recruitment and Integration (SIRI) to get the residence document. You can book an appointment here:

- Representatives from Zealand will join the Registration Day in SIRI the **25th of January**. Moreover there will be Registration Days the **28th of January and the 1st of February**.

- You are able to apply for your CPR number online here: [Welcome! \(f2-cloud.com\)](https://www.welcome2denmark.com/) and pick it up in the International House in Copenhagen or book an appointment in your local municipality service (Borgerservice) when you have your residence certificate.
- **Be aware:** you must be registered with an adress in Denmark in order to get the CPR number and yellow card
- NON-EU students can apply for CPR number with residence permit documents from SIRI
