On one hand, AI has the potential to significantly enhance productivity and efficiency, automating routine tasks and enabling humans to focus on more creative and strategic aspects of work. This could lead to the creation of new job categories and industries. On the other hand, this shift brings about substantial challenges with one of the biggest concerns being job displacement, as machines and algorithms become capable of performing tasks that were traditionally done by humans. This could lead to a significant restructuring of the workforce, with some roles becoming obsolete. The key questions many production and manufacturing companies will face are: How can we prepare and get ready for this transition?


